Sub: Storage facilities for import pulses.

Ref: Circular No. TM/B/4-3/21 of 1996-97 dated 29.07.2015.

Vide this office circular dated 29.07.2015 referred to above, the Trade was informed about extension of the scheme of storage of import pulses in the notified areas upto a maximum period of 180 days for a period of one year from 01.08.2015, subject to approval of the Board.

- 2. The Board has now accorded approval to extension of the said scheme.
- 3. Further, on the request received from India Pulses and Grains Association for continuation of the concessional scheme of storage for 270 days for the ongoing monsoon period, the Board has also accorded approval to extension of the scheme till 31.10.2015.
- 4. Please note that the concessional scheme of storage period of 270 days (on recovery of concessional charges as per circular No.TM/D/4-3/4 of 1996-97 dated 04.04.2015) shall be applicable only for the cargo presently lying in the Port's warehouse and will remain valid till 31.10.2015. Cargo lying beyond 270 days after 31.10.2015 shall attract demurrage charges as per Section 3.1 (B) of Chapter-III of SOR.
- 5. You are requested to inform your members accordingly.
