Sub : I.V. Barges plying beyond I.V. limits -Permission for.

Gentlemen,

I.V. Barges intending to operate at Revdanda / Dharamtar / Dhanu beyond I.V. limits for lighterage purposes (short distance in open sea), it is necessary that, the barges should be assigned with restricted load line and obtain a specific permission from this department for operation beyond I.V. limits. In addition, LSA, FFA, LSS & Radio Communication Equipments have to be upgraded to the extent, as have been communicated to you from time to time.

Since sufficient time has already been allowed after the above requirements were conveyed, no barges shall now be permitted to undertake ship to shore operation beyond I.V. limits unless they comply with the above requirements.
